Presentation on New Borough Hall Design - Kevin Settembrino, Settembrino Architecture Mr. Settembrino discussed his firm and listed his firms credentials along with other municipalities they have worked with. He also noted his experience with FEMA. Mr. Settembrino explained that he looked at the Borough's design stands and architecture in the Borough to came up with a rendering of the what a new municipal building for Highlands could potentially look like and fit with the community.

Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) Public Hearing – Dale Leubner

Mr. Leubner reviewed a recent meeting and made recommendations on the areas of borough infrastructure that need repairs and noted that he believed that sanitary system needs to be improved. Mr. Leubner presented a town map showing the area that they would want to work on. He further explained the benefits of less water going into the system. Councilmember Card thanked Councilmember D'Arrigo for her statement. He explained his thoughts on Tilt-Up and made accusations against Borough officials pointing out it is an illegal structure.

Councilmember Kane-Wells agreed it could have been communicated better and stated that there was no ill intent. She stated that she is not related to Mr. Anton and noted how she was first approached about this project. Councilmember Kane-Wells stated that offers have been made to pay for permits and expressed that she was unhappy at the removal cost.

Mayor Nolan stated that another municipality expressed interested in this project and the Borough is in discussions with them which the Council discussed.

Councilmember Broullon pointed out the dates of the recreation summer program, noting the work will have to be done accordingly. She wanted to make clear the resolution awarding the contract to take down the structure.

Other Business:

Borough Engineers Status Report – Dale Leubner

Mr. Leubner reported that the Streetscape Project is going well and will wrap up soon at which point the Borough will move on to phase II. He updated the Council on the Shrewsbury

Avenue/North Street Project, Veteran's Park electric, Bay Avenue Streetscape Phase II, and CDBG Applications.

Councilmember Broullon requested information on residential property demolitions program. Mr. Leubner noted that it is in preliminary.

Mayor Nolan opened the meeting to public comments on the report.

Stacy Pritchard, Bay Avenue, asked when trees and bicycle racks would be installed. Mr. Leubner responded that they are working with the contractor and the HBP to complete this. Councilmember Card asked for input from the community for locations.

Unknown Resident stated he has damage to his house on Shrewsbury Avenue and wanted to know the timeframe to put in a claim. Mr. Chabarek stated he had 90 days.

Tricia Rivera, Waterwitch Avenue, asked when will the flooding be addressed. Mr. Leubner and Council provided an estimated timeline. Ms. Rivera asked about the check-valves. Councilmember Card stated that the State still has not reviewed documents submitted on those.

Ms. Rivera asked about the condition of Captain's Cove Marina. Councilmember Card stated that code enforcement is working on it.

Greg Wells, Bayside Ave, asked how the Borough is paying for the second phase of Streetscape. Councilmember Card answered that the money was reallocated from another project.

Tricia Rivera asked if the run off from Waterwitch would be addressed. Councilmember Card responded that the Borough is actively finding a solution and funding. Ms. Rivera commented that flooding mitigation is more important than Streetscape. Councilmember Card explained that grant money can only be used for the outlined project.

Mayors Appointment to Planning Board

Mayor Nolan appointed Joseph Blewett to the Planning Board as the non-elected Borough Official for the remainder of the unexpired term ending 12/31/16. Mayor Nolan thanked Chief Blewett for his service to the Borough.

Highlands First Aide Monthly Report

Councilmember D'Arrigo stated the information is in the packet from last month and is available to the public.

Streetscape Project - William Iler Tree Request

Mr. Iler made a request to plant Eastern Redbuds as part of the Streetscape. Councilmember Card stated he was not opposed to including it if it meets criteria and price. Mr. Iler stated that of the four types of trees selected for this project, one of them was the Eastern Redbud.

Christian Lee, Navesink Avenue, stated that he research the types of trees that were recommended for this project and the Eastern Redbud was one of them. Dale Leubner stated that no trees had been ordered. Council discussed this matter.

Mr. Iler stated that multiple Borough lights shine in the apartments and he would like to have the light shielded. Mr. Leubner stated there is no shields but different types of light bulbs but they are very costly. Mr. Iler asked if the lights could be relocated. Councilmember Card commented that it is to late in the process and commented that they will look into the light by the old borough hall.

Mr. Lee mentioned business owners were concerned about lights, trees blocking their buildings and signs.

Mary Salzman, Snug Harbor, suggested the Borough use Japanese Maples.

Highlands Fire Department Bonfire – Councilmember Kane-Wells

Councilmember Kane-Wells stated that the first bonfire was a big success and thanked all who donated and volunteered. She also noted that the Girl Scouts did plantings around the community center as a service project.

PUBLIC PORTION:

Mayor Nolan opened the meeting to the public.

Carol Bucco, Shore Drive, jokingly asked if another municipality could take the statues in Veteran's Park.

Kim Skorka, Shore Drive, asked if the borough could do a reverse 911 concerning mosquito control and standing water. Mayor Nolan agreed to put it on the website.

Ms. Skorka asked if there was a blood drive in town. Councilmember Kane-Wells noted that there had been.

Tina Kaemmerer, Linden Avenue, asked about flowering trees and if they will attract bees.

Christian Lee answered Ms. Kaemmerer's question.

Councilmember Card reprimanded Councilmember Kane-Wells for texting during the meeting

Tricia Rivera, Waterwitch, inquired what happened to the Snowflake grant. Mayor Nolan said gave a brief explanation and Mr. Geoghegan stated he would look into it.

Ms. Rivera inquired if Jones Creek be dredged more often. Mr. Leubner discussed the dredging issue and Mayor Nolan directed DPW to clean out the VFW section.

Mary Saltzman, Snug Harbor Avenue, asked if there was a regulation on the frequency of when meeting minutes had to be posted. Mr. Chabarek will communicate this to the Planning Board.

Ms. Saltzman, commented that she was confused about the awarding of the contract to remove the Tilt-Up if we might be giving it to someone else. Mayor Nolan explained about the permits and the other municipality would have to obtain and noted there is no official agreement. Council discussed the Tilt-Up with Mr. Saltzman.

Ms. Saltzman asked if the library would be reinstated in the Recreation center. Mayor Nolan explained the current use of the room. The Council discussed the future of a library in the Borough.

Greg Wells asked that the recreation committee discuss the possibility of a library.

Cynthia Ober of Navesink Avenue asked if we have a copy of the proposal for (inaudible). Councilmember Card offered his copy.

LoriAnn Nolan, Snug Harbor Avenue, stated that you can go to any Monmouth County Library for free to Highlands residents at this time. She reminded people to sign up for the Summer Kidfest, the Kid Connection, and teen programs. Ms. Nolan inquired that status of getting lifeguards. Mr. Geoghegan replied that he contacted two companies regarding lifeguards and noted that neither are available for this summer. The Council discussed lifeguards for Borough beaches.

Tina Kaemmerer, Linden Avenue, asked if the Tilt-Up will continue to be fenced. Mayor Nolan stated that there is no discussion to take down the fence and Councilmember Kane-Wells inquired on the rental cost of the fence which Council discussed.

Katie Reed, Snug Harbor Avenue, expressed interest in joining the Substandard Housing Committee. She inquired what checks and balances this committee used. Mayor Nolan commented that the Borough with follows the statue on this.

Ms. Reed expressed a dislike of the Tilt-Up and asked Mr. Geoghegan what he thought of it. Mr. Geoghegan stated that he takes direction from the council.

Fred Anton, Ocean Township, stated is interested in providing the municipality that is interested in taking the Tilt-up with engineering.

Unknown Resident, Central Avenue, asked about the removal of the Tilt-Up. Mr. Chabarek stated that they are moving as expeditiously as possible and are exploring all avenues.

Carol Bucco, Shore Drive, asked why we have not hired any lifeguards. Mayor Nolan stated that they are doing everything they can to get lifeguards.

Rosemary Flannery, Central Avenue, asked if the new borough hall would be in the same location and who would fund it. Mayor Nolan advised it would not be at the same location and that it would be partially funded by FEMA and take a few years.

Ms. Flannery thanked Councilmember Kane-Wells for the Bonfire as it was non-political. Council discussed having bonfires more often. Ms. Flannery suggested charging out-of-towners for the beaches and use those fees for Borough events which the Council continued to discuss with Ms. Flannery.

Councilmember Kane-Wells spoke of family-oriented programs on the beach and asked Jackie Kane discuss an upcoming event.

Jackie Kane informed the public of an upcoming Sandcastle Contest.

Kim Skorka, Shore Drive, asked if there will be an emergency meeting regarding the Tilt-Up if the other town is interested which Mayor Nolan confirmed.

Bill Iler, South Linden Avenue, offered to assist in organizing the move of the Tilt-Up. Mr. Iler stated that he heard someone was willing to pay for the CAFRA permits so the structure could stay. Mayor Nolan confirmed that people have offered money to pay for permits. Councilmember Card inquired if someone were willing to pay for the permits for CAFRA would they be willing to pay the possible fines if it is denied.

Cynthia Fair, Navesink Avenue, asked about demolishing the Tilt-Up here and whether or not the contractor would get credit for the steel. Councilmember Card replied the contractor regards the steel as part of their cost proposals.

Rosemary Flannery, Central Avenue, asked if the Borough could learn something from Tilt-Up and requested the Borough to notice residents prior to the placement of public structures. She stated that she would like more communication between council members and more information out to the public.

Greg Wells, Bayside Drive, feels that the Tilt-Up is facing the wrong direction.
