Workshop

Kevin Settembrino – New Municipal Building Schematics

Mr. Settembrino explained some ideas for the new Borough Hall building and discussed square footage, parking, and the various sections of the building. Councilmember Ryan expressed concern over the traffic pattern for the property in regard to Route 36.

Mr. Settembrino noted that this was only the first draft which included the First Aid Squad as part of the building. Council discussed moving the First Aid Squad to the location of the current Borough Hall trailer. Council inquired about having the meeting room also being a court room which Mr. Settembrino discussed the options available to them.

Council brought up the idea of a green roof which Mr. Settembrino noted the structural and financial impacts of such. Mayor O'Neil pointed out that the south side of the building will require noise and light dampening for the residents. Council continued to discuss with Mr. Settembrino the first draft which was presented to them and how they wanted things changed. Mr. Settembrino provided the Council with a rough estimate of the costs for the building, with and without certain features.

Other Business

Engineer's Report

Mr. Herrman updated the Council and public on the status of several projects including: the completion of the 2017 Roads Project, electric for Veterans' Park, police sewer connection, FEMA grant, and flat valves. He also informed the Council on common questions the Zoning Office had been receiving.

Councilmember D'Arrigo explained to the public the process for speaking to homeowner's insurance companies in regard to the new flood maps.

Administrator's Report

Ms. Gonzales reported on upcoming Borough events and noting the dates of each. She updated the public on jetting of sewer lines, the Valley Street Drainage Project, in addition to, the paving and milling of several roads and a Borough parking lot.

Ms. Gonzales noted that the County would be repaving Bay Avenue in the new future. Mr. Herrman recommended that anyone on Bay Avenue that will need to do work which will involve opening the street should do it soon.

Mayor O'Neil commented that multiple streets will be restriped. He provided an update on drainage projects and added that there is a problem with the sanitary sewer which is their top priority to solve. Mayor O'Neil recognized the hard work put into the summer concerts.

Councilmember Broullon introduced Deputy Clerk & Cashier Rosa Pace. Mayor O'Neil stated what her responsibilities would include.

Councilmember Braswell announced that in the last ten (10) months there has been more drainage improvements that the last decade.

Mayor O'Neil informed the public that the Borough is working on solving the Monmouth Hills issue.

Councilmember D'Arrigo listed the upcoming Recreation programs and provided an update on Summer Camp registration. Mayor O'Neil stated that cameras would be installed at the Community Center.

Police Chief's Report

Chief Burton stated that there is a lot of ongoing construction and encouraged all to pay attention.

Presented the Council a petition from the residents of Sandpiper Condos requesting a parking spot be removed as it is causing unsafe conditions and abstracting views when turning. Chief Burton stated that it would be looked at. Ms. Shaw explained to the Council the traffic problems on Shore Drive caused by commuters and trespassing on their property. Ms. Gonzales stated that she also would investigate the situation.

Inquired what the discussion on Captain's Cove was in the Executive Session. Mayor O'Neil informed her that the conversation was on redevelopment. Ms. Rivera questioned if the CDBG could be used to aid in correcting the Route 36 runoff problem. Ms. Gonzales asked that Ms. Rivera call her the following day at which time she would provide her an update.

Ms. Rivera expressed concern over the building of larger structures would strain the Borough's sewer system with all the additional bathrooms. She also informed the Council of a streetlight which was out, reported to JCP&L and had not be fixed, in addition to, a fallen stop sign. She also suggested putting a four (4) way stop at Waterwitch and Bay Avenues.
