


What Has Changed?

- ✓ Increasing concern with winds (Storm Warning and Wind Advisory issued)
- ✓ Coastal Flood Warning and Coastal Flood Advisory Issued









Main Points

Hazard	Impacts	Location	Timing
Heavy Rain/ Flooding	Widespread rainfall amounts of 1 to 3 inches are expected. Localized flooding is possible.	Eastern Pennsylvania, New Jersey, Delaware, and eastern Maryland	Through Sunday
Coastal Flooding	Widespread minor to moderate coastal flooding is expected.	Tidal areas of New Jersey and Delaware, including Delaware Bay and the tidal Delaware River	Around the times of high tide from Saturday night through Sunday night
Wind	Sustained winds of 25 to 35 mph are forecast with gusts up to 55 mph. Tree damage and power outages are possible.	Highest winds are expected along the coast, but windy conditions are expected across the region	Saturday through Sunday
Marine9O	Sustained winds of 25 to 35 knots with gusts as high as 50 knots. Seas building to 10 to 15 feet.	The coastal waters of New Jersey and Delaware, and Delaware Bay	Tonight through Sunday





Summary of Greatest Impacts










Coastal Flooding



- ✓ Coastal flooding is forecast for several consecutive high tide cycles beginning with the Saturday night high tide.
- ✓ Highest risk for moderate flooding is with the Saturday night high tide from Barnegat Bay to Fenwick Island
- ✓ Back bays, including Barnegat Bay, Rehoboth Bay, and Indian River Bay could have higher impacts from the tidal flooding and could have few, if any, breaks in tidal flooding in between tide cycles








Forecast Maximum Wind Gusts

Event Summary

- ✓ A late season coastal storm will bring coastal flooding, very windy conditions, and heavy rain to the region.
- ✓ Minor to Moderate tidal flooding is forecast beginning with the Saturday night high tide and continuing into at least Monday.
- Moderate tidal flooding is most likely from Fenwick Island DE to Barnegat Bay NJ with the Saturday night high tide
- Back bays could have higher impacts and little, if any, breaks from the tidal flooding in between tide cycles
- ✓ Very windy conditions could result in tree and power line damage throughout the weekend.
- ✓ Gale to storm force conditions are expected on the waters.
- ✓ Widespread rainfall amounts of 1 to 3 inches are expected. This could result in localized flooding. The flooding threat could increase if rain amounts are higher than currently forecast.
