Where we are

Pack 22 is proud to welcome children and their families from the Navesink, NJ area – Highlands, Atlantic Highlands, Middletown, and the surrounding area. Pack 22 is an official Boy Scouts of America pack and sponsored by Navesink Hook and Ladder.

Our family-centered programming includes hands-on activities teaching skills in citizenship, character, personal fitness, and leadership for youth in grades K to 5. Pack 22 provides ready-made opportunities for your family to do fun things together—because together—we can all grow into our very best future selves!



What do Cub Scouts do?

Hiking, archery, camping, launching rockets, service projects, shooting BB guns, and more! These are just a few of the exciting activities your Scout will participate in with Pack 22. Besides being fun, these activities offer opportunities for growth, achievement, and family involvement.

Pack 22 hosts one Pack meeting a month (all scouts), plus a den meeting (just scouts your age) and a special event. Events might be a service project, practicing a skill, or just having fun!

How can Cub Scouting help my child?

- Your Scout will be taught practical skills they won't learn anywhere else – like archery and target shooting, science and social skills, and the importance of helping others.
- Scouting focuses on the personal development of your Scout. A Scout is trustworthy, loyal, helpful, friendly, courteous, kind, obedient, cheerful, thrifty, brave, clean, and reverent. Your child will learn to be helpful in your home, neighborhood, and community.
- It helps Scouts strengthen connections to their local communities, supporting their growth and development.
- Scouting is a family activity. Your entire family will develop deep connections with other Scout families who share your same values of family, responsibility, and community.

How much does it cost?

The 16-month program fee is \$275 dollars. This includes:

- Official Pack 22 t-shirt
- 1 Pinewood Derby car and official race
- At least one pack meeting, den meeting, and special event per month
- A lifetime of skills, connections, and adventures
- Membership until *December 2023*.

This fee does not include your Cub Scout uniform, the Handbook, or admission fees at special outings.

Compare the value of Cub Scouts to other youth programs ...

- Karate: \$150/month (\$1,500/year) – one 60-minute class per week
- Swimming: \$120/month (\$1,440/year) – one 30-minute class per week
- Baseball: \$200/month (\$2,400/year) for three-month season, plus equipment fees

FRIENDLY. Be a friend to everyone, even people who are very different from you.

COURTEOUS. Be polite to everyone and always use good manners.

KIND. Treat others as you want to be treated. Never harm or kill any living thing without good reason.

OBEDIENT. Follow the rules of your family, school, and pack. Obey the laws of your community and country.

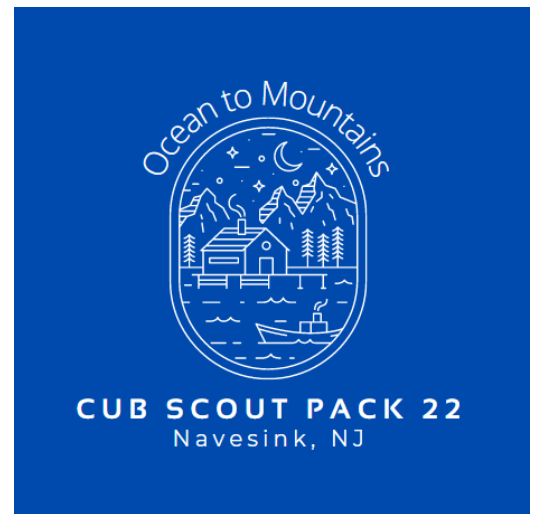
CHEERFUL. Look for the bright side of life. Cheerfully do tasks that come your way. Try to help others be happy.
