Administrator's Report

Ms. Gonzales reported on the various meetings she attended including but not limited to: Funding and Mitigation, Bayshore Coastal Advisory Committee, and Monmouth County Regional Health Commission No. 1. She mentioned upcoming meetings with the Arts Council to further discuss a photography program. Ms. Gonzales noted that she met with a local student who attends Columbia University who will be conducting an environmental study of the Borough as their Cap Stone project. She informed the public that there would be a Parkfest in May and a Film Festival in October.

Mayor O'Neil updated the public on the Valley Street Project.

Police Chief's Report

Chief Burton stated that they were awarded a grant for bullet proof vests and another for DUI enforcement and why these are important. He spoke about another grant opportunity for Safe Routes to Schools that they would apply for.

Open the meeting to the Public for Comment

Name: Dale Bahr Address: Portland Road, Wyndmoor Condos Submitted to the Council photos of the condo complex's drive way and the damage caused to the guard rail by a kit and run, the catch basin from a drunk driver, and added that there was also a blind driveway in the immediate proximity. She noted the problem that Portland Road has with speeders and drunk driver coming around the curve, and littering. Ms. Bahr asked the Council to consider adding additional speed limit signs, a speed bump and increased enforcement.

Mayor O'Neil stated that he would have the signs and catch basin looked and at ask the police to look into increased enforcement. Councilmember Broullon also mentioned that the Council would look into other traffic calming measures as well.

Name: Claudette D'Arrigo

Address: Sea Drift Avenue

Ms. D'Arrigo read a statement that noted that Ordinance 16-13 removed all financial compensation for serving on the Council. She stated that at Steve Solop's request for a liaison to work on looking into concerns involving the Highlands Business Partnership (HBP) she was appointed as such and in that capacity she requested documents several times and was continually denied access. Ms. D'Arrigo asked that the HBP be disbanded until those documents could be provided to the Council.

Ms. D'Arrigo questioned the ethics of the HBP using the tax payer money to rent their business office from the building that Carla Cefalo-Braswell and Councilmember Braswell owns in addition to paying Councilmember Braswell for the services he provides to the HBP through his business.

Ms. Skorka informed the Council that she was served a ceased and desist letter by the HBP and stated that she is only telling the facts of the situation. She explained that after looking at some of their records it seems like a majority of their events run at a loss. Ms. Skorka provided a letter to the Council noting her concerns and expressed her willingness to meet with Council to discuss.

Address: Portland Road

Mr. Zill inquired when Portland Road would be repaved. Mayor O'Neil stated that it would be after the NJ Natural Gas project was complete in late summer. Mr. Zill inquired if the Code Enforcment officer was out of Middletown now to which Mayor O'Neil stated that the Borough has their own. Mr. Zill asked the Council if the Construction on 88 Portland Road was being monitored. Ms. Gonzales listed all the various departments and agencies that are continually checking on the progress.
