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

What Has Changed?

- Coastal Flood Watches Upgraded to Coastal Flood Warnings, with Coastal Flood Advisories for other areas.
- ✓ Refined timing of peak winds.



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Main Points


Hazard	Impacts	Location	Timing
Coastal Flooding	Moderate to major coastal flooding forecast for southern coastal New Jersey and Delaware. Minor flooding elsewhere (see threat map)	Atlantic coastal NJ and DE, Delaware Bay.	Greatest inundation Saturday afternoon & evening high tide. Some lingering flooding possible Saturday night
Wind	Strong winds may result in isolated downed trees, power lines, and power outages. Max wind gusts 35-60 mph	Entire area; strongest gusts (50-60 mph) restricted to the immediate coast	Late Friday night through Saturday
Marine	Storm-force and Gale-force winds. Dangerous seas building up to 10-15 feet.	Across all marine zones.	Friday night – Saturday night Strongest winds and highest seas Saturday.
Heavy Rain	Widespread 2-3 inches of rain. Localized urban & small stream flooding possible (5 to 15% risk)	Entire area; heaviest rainfall will likely be along the coast	Occasional heavy rain lifting northward Saturday morning; another round late in the day possible.
Tornadoes	The threat of tornadoes is low, but an isolated tornado could occur.	Southern portions of eastern MD, southern DE.	Saturday afternoon and early evening.




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Risk for Moderate to Major Coastal Flooding



Major coastal flooding forecast for coastal areas of Kent and Sussex counties in Delaware.

A few locations in coastal areas of Atlantic and Cape May counties in New Jersey may flirt with major coastal flooding levels.

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Risk for Moderate to Major Coastal Flooding



Coastal Flood Warnings have been issued for the Saturday afternoon/evening high tide for coastal areas of southern Delaware, the Atlantic coast of southern New Jersey, with advisories adjacent to those areas.

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
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Strong to Damaging Winds Along the Coast



High Wind Warnings (gusts 50 to 60 mph) in effect for coastal portions of New Jersey and Delaware from Tonight through Saturday Evening.

Wind Advisories (gusts 40 to 50 mph) are also in effect for inland coastal counties.

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
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Strong to Damaging Winds Along the Coast

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Maximum wind gusts up to 50-60 mph forecasted for coastal areas of Delaware and New Jersey. Maximum wind gusts 30 to 40 mph inland. Strongest winds are expected from mid-morning through early afternoon Saturday.

Downed trees and power lines resulting in localized power outages are possible, mainly close to the coast.

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Dangerous Marine Conditions

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Storm-force and Gale-force winds expected across all marine zones.

Maximum wind gusts up to 50 kts across Atlantic waters and mouth of the Delaware Bay.

Dangerous seas building up to 10-15 feet.

Strongest winds and highest seas will occur on Saturday.












Dangerous Marine Conditions



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Excessive Rainfall Outlook – Flash Flood Potential

Late Tonight



High Risk Moderate Risk At least 40%

Slight Risk At least 15% Marginal Risk At least 5% * Within 25 miles of a point. May not represent localized

flooding threat over burn scars.

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Sunday



Localized urban & small-stream flooding possible mainly on Saturday, with a lingering threat mainly NW areas Sunday.

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
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Storm Total Rainfall Amounts

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Widespread 2-3 inches of rainfall across the entire region from Friday night through Sunday night.

Occasional heavy rain lifting northward Saturday morning; another round of downpours possible late in the day.

Rain showers continue into Sunday and begin to taper off Sunday night.

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
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Low Risk for Tornadoes



Tornado risk remains minimal at this time and restricted to southern DE/MD.

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Event Summary

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- A strong coastal low will impact our region, with greatest impacts expected along the DE and NJ coastlines. Regardless if this coastal system is named, or classified as "tropical" as it tracks northward, impacts will remain the same: coastal flooding, strong winds, heavy rain, and dangerous seas and surf.
- ✓ MAJOR to Moderate coastal flooding is possible along the DE and NJ coast with the greatest highest water levels during the Saturday afternoon/evening high tide.
- Strong winds along the coast and across the waters could result in isolated power outages. For marine interests, this will result in dangerous winds and seas for all vessels.
- Heavy rainfall at times through the weekend could lead to localized urban or smallstream flooding.
- ✓ Dangerous rip currents, high surf, and beach erosion remain a concern along all area beaches through the weekend.


